TREASURER'S REPORT May 2024 - Ron Salles

We continue to carry a reserve in the General Fund. The size of the reserve fluctuates from month to month, depending on the income and debts occurred, but most of the time there is enough working capital to keep our bills paid as they are received, along with any unexpected expenses that suddenly appear. The General Fund is the money we use to pay the everyday bills, like power and heat, pastor's salary, insurance, office expenses, etc. I continue to pay our bills on time.

As of March 21, 2024 we are officially disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. Although on March 19, 2024 we have been accepted to join the Global Methodist Church (more to come as we receive it), we are currently operating as an independent church. We have a new federal ID number (EIN) and a new NYS Tax Exempt Number for the Avoca Methodist Church, Inc. This means we must change all of our business accounts over to the new name and tax numbers. We are currently working on doing just that. This will not change under the Global Methodist Church.

On the Mission Fund side, we also have some modest mission reserves as we build for the missions later in the year. This year we are concentrating on our local missions as our missions' projects; The Campership Fund (Scouts), The Ramp Mission (The Ramp Guys), The Lighthouse Mission (The Lighthouse Christmas), and The Avoca - Kanona Food Pantry. We are also looking into a mission project for the upcoming school year.

As of June 2^{nd} the Avoca – Kanona Food Pantry, Refrigerator Fund has reached \$1450.00 of the \$2,000.00 goal. Thank you!

IS THIS FOOD EXPIRED? Understanding Date Labels

The dates that food companies put on packages are not regulated and do not mean that the food is unsafe to eat, except in the case of baby formula. Most foods are still tasty and nutritious after the date has passed. Not sure if food is spoiled? Check for off odor, flavor or texture.

"Best By" or "Best If Used By" Date

This date tells you when the food will have the best flavor. It is still safe to eat past this date.

"Use By" or "Expiration Date

This is the last date that the product will be at its peak quality. It is still safe to eat past this date (except for baby formula).

"Packing/Manufacturing Date"

This is the date used by manufacturers for tracking. **It is not an expiration date** – it is not related to food quality or safety.

"Sell By" Date

This tells the store how long to display the product for sale. **It is still safe to eat** past this date.

GOOD UP TO ONE YEAR AFTER DATE:

- Packaged food like cereal, pasta, dried beans, and baking mixes
- Frozen foods
- Canned goods including soup, condiments, meat, fruit, and vegetables

GOOD UP TO 30 DAYS AFTER THE DATE:

- Butter
- Cheese
- Eggs

GOOD UP TO <u>SEVEN DAYS</u> AFTER THE DATE:

- Milk
- Yogurt
- Cream Cheese

RECIPE CORNER Cinnamon Rhubarb Bread

Ingredients:

Butter, for greasing the pan 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking soda ½ teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon cinnamon ¾ cup brown sugar ½ cup canola oil ½ cup buttermilk

1 egg

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
2 cups diced rhubarb
1/2 cup chopped pecans

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease an 8 x 4-inch loaf pan

In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, salt and cinnamon. Stir in the brown sugar, oil, buttermilk, egg, and vanilla, combining thoroughly. Fold in the rhubarb and pecans.

Pour the batter evenly into the prepared loaf pan. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out dry. Let cool in the pan slightly, then cool completely on a rack before slicing.

5-Cup Ambrosia Fruit Salad

Ingredients:

1 cup crushed pineapple, well drained1 cup mandarin oranges, well drained1 cup miniature fruit-flavored marshmallows1 cup shredded sweetened coconut1 cup sour cream

Directions:

In a large bowl, combine pineapple, mandarin oranges, marshmallows, and coconut. Fold in sour cream, mixing well. Cover and refrigerate at least 4 hours or overnight before serving. Serves 8.
